**Refreshments after Mass:** Everyone is very welcome to stay behind after Sunday morning Masses and share a cuppa! Tea and Coffee are served in the Parish Centre on the opposite side of the carpark after 9.00 a.m. and 11.00 a.m. Sunday Masses.

**Toilets:** The toilet is located near the side entrance: **children should not go out of Church unaccompanied.** Please use the disinfectant wipes to clean all surfaces after every use—dispose of them in the bin but do not flush them down the toilet. Thank you.

# **Advent & Christmas Appeal 2024**



Every year we run an appeal in Advent and Christmas, so that this season is not just about consumption but compassion! Last year we raised almost £4000.00 for Father Moses in war-torn Ethiopia. This year we are supporting something much closer to home. Many people in our own communities are isolated or even trapped because of mental or physical difficulties: council run social services often refer such individuals to other groups. One such is a Catholic organisation, run by the Brothers of Charity - a religious order founded in Belgium, inspired by the example of Saint Vincent de Paul. The Brothers were first invited to Rochdale by Bishop (later Cardinal) Vaughan, where they ran the Buckley Hall Orphanage until its closure. While still a worldwide religious order, in this country they have moved into compassionate care for the vulnerable, and actually have a base down the road in Bury. From there the workers embrace people with so many problems across Greater Manchester - often those whom no other charity or organisation will take on. They seek to provide help, companionship, practical support and most importantly a sense of dignity to people who are often abused, forgotten or dismissed in our society. While they receive basic funding from local government, they go above and beyond, contributing out of their own pockets to transport clients, provide them with activities and outings, and generally rebuilding broken lives and restoring lost dignity. This year we are asking for funds to support this work: over the coming weeks we will share some stories of the work done by the organisation, and there will be a collection basket for donations from next weekend until 12th January 2025, the end of the Christmas Season.

# From "Dilexit Nos"

Pope Francis has recently published his fourth encyclical letter, entitled "Dilexit Nos" ("He loved us"), all about the Heart of Jesus, and the way of the heart.

"When we witness the outbreak of new wars, with the complicity, tolerance or indifference of other countries, or petty power struggles over partisan interests, we may be tempted to conclude that our world is losing its heart. We need only to see and listen to the elderly women - from both sides - who are at the mercy of these devastating conflicts. It is heart -breaking to see them mourning for their murdered grandchildren, or longing to die themselves after losing the homes where they spent their entire lives. To see these elderly women weep, and not feel that this is something intolerable, is a sign of a world that has grown heartless. Whenever a person thinks, questions and reflects on his or her true identity, strives to understand the deeper questions of life and to seek God, or experiences the thrill of catching a glimpse of truth, it leads to the realization that our fulfilment as human beings is found in love. In loving, we sense that we come to know the purpose and goal of our existence in this world. Everything comes together in a state of coherence and harmony. It follows that, in contemplating the meaning of our lives, perhaps the most decisive question we can ask is, "Do I ĥave a heart?"

### WHAT'S IN A CHURCH? 11: Votive Candles



One of the most distinctive features of any Catholic church is the rack of little votive candles in front of altars and statues. The largest I have ever seen was in Cologne Cathedral, where there is a thirty foot long row of votive candles in a transept! Similar to this is Lourdes, where on the other side of the river pilgrims leave candles (some of them mas-

sive): there is an inscription in many languages on the votive candles stands in Lourdes: "*May this light prolong my prayer*," which gives us the meaning of these little flames. They are a **symbol** of our prayer not some magic device. The idea is that we have a prayer in mind, light a candle and sort of "place" our prayer in that flame, so that when we leave, it somehow continues - and at the same time we continue to hold onto our prayer, knowing we have shared it with the person the statue or altar commemorates. We also make a donation - not buying a candle, and certainly not "buying" a prayer - but putting a little bit of ourselves into the flickering flame, as a sign that the prayer comes from our heart, through the intercession of Our Lady or a saint, to our loving Father. *Next week: The Advent Wreath*
